Students have also been introduced to the mangrove and marine ecosystems. For the latter, broader conservation issues such as the impact of plastic pollution on marine biodiversity were shared through the Keppel Green Seeds Plastic Programme.

Green Activists in our GAIA Club have been meticulously documenting the wildlife in their school under the NParks' Greening Schools for Biodiversity programme. They also participated in Green Wave during the NParks' Biodiversity Week for Schools, planting the biodiversity-attracting Red Tree Shrubs (*Leearubra*) in the school. Over three months, Primary 1 and 2 students received outdoor education lessons under the Programme for Active Learning (PAL). Activities from the Young Botanist Programme by the Singapore Science Centre were integrated into the lessons.
