1. CELEBRATING OUR STUDENTS' ACHIEVEMENTS

Our students have done well in both the academic and non-academic domains. We would like to send them our congratulations.

• Singapore Youth Festival (SYF) 2017 - Art Exhibition

A group of our lower primary pupils achieved the Certificate of Recognition at the SYF 2017 Art Exhibition : Artist & Space. Their artwork, titled 'Our Secret Hideout', was showcased at SCAPE from 5 July to 16 July. 2. APPRECIATION TO PARENT SUPPORT GROUP (PSG)

We would like to thank our PSG for their support at the Lower Primary Sports Carnival held on 8 August. PSG members were present to provide our P1 and P2 students with tattoo stickers of our national flag as part of the school's National Day celebrations. In addition, they also cheered for our young athletes as they competed during the sports carnival.

3. P5 ADVENTURE OUTDOOR CAMP (14 TO 16 SEPTEMBER)

The annual 3-day-2-night P5 Outdoor Camp provides opportunity for P5 students to engage in a wide range of physical and outdoor activities that will develop their personal growth in leadership, confidence and team spirit amongst their peers. Parents/Guardian may refer to the letter which was issued earlier on 14 August.

4. PSLE LISTENING COMPREHENSION EXAMINATION (15 SEPTEMBER)

P6 students will sit for their PSLE Listening Comprehension on 15 September. They would need to adhere to the reporting timings given by their Form Teachers and be in their school uniform. Parents/Guardians are to make the necessary transport arrangement for their children/ wards.

P1 to P4 students do not need to report to school on that day.

5. 2017 PSLE WRITTEN EXAMINATION (28 SEPTEMBER TO 4 OCTOBER)

The 2017 PSLE Written Examination will take place from 28 September to 4 October. Parents/Guardians may refer to the booklet, *Instructions to Candidates*, which was issued to all P6 students in May 2017 for the full PSLE timetable. The timetable is also available at the following SEAB website:

P6 students will have to continue attending school as usual after PSLE from 5 October. Programmes to enrich our students in their holistic development and to prepare them for transition to secondary

school have been planned for them. Students who are unable to attend school are to produce medical certificates or letters with valid reason.

6. P2 SWIM SAFER (28 SEPTEMBER, 2 OCTOBER, 7 & 8 NOVEMBER)

The objective of this programme for P2 students is to develop in our young important life skills such as water confidence and water safety. They will participate in four sessions for this programme which will be held during school hours. More details will be provided nearer the date.

7. P3 HEALTHIER BODY AND MIND PROGRAMME (28 SEPTEMBER, AND 2 OCTOBER)

P3 students will embark on this special sports learning journey on these two days during school hours. Through this authentic learning experience, our students will learn essential fundamental movement skills and desired values such as resilience, diligence, respect and integrity. These skills and values are essential building blocks for them to lead a healthier lifestyle that would benefit their body and mind. In addition, they will also have the opportunity to interact with professional sports players in Singapore. More details will be provided nearer the date.

8. P4 SOCIAL STUDIES FIELD-BASED LEARNING (28 AND 29 SEPTEMBER)

In line with the P4 Social Studies curriculum, P4 students will be going on a Field-based Learning (FbL) to the National Museum of Singapore (NMS) and a heritage trail at Kampong Glam and Little India over two consecutive days. At NMS, students will go back in history to recognise the contributions of early migrants who helped to develop Singapore in the early days. They will also deepen their understanding of the Malay and Indian ethnic culture through a heritage learning journey to Kampong Glam and Little India. More details will be provided nearer the date.

9. P1 AND P2 HOME-BASED LEARNING (HBL) (29 SEPTEMBER)

P1 and P2 students will have HBL on 29 September, Friday, and do not need to report to school. Lessons will be prepared by our teachers to enable P1 and P2 students to experience an alternative form of learning at home. Further details will be provided nearer the date.

10. CHILDREN'S DAY SCHOOL HOLIDAY (6 OCTOBER)

The school will celebrate Children's Day on 5 October, Thursday. School reporting and dismissal time, and all scheduled after-school programmes on that day remain unchanged.

6 October, Friday, will be the scheduled school holiday for Children's Day.

11. PSLE MARKING EXERCISE & P1–P5 HOME-BASED LEARNING (HBL) (19 – 24 OCTOBER)

PSLE Marking Exercise will be conducted from 19 to 24 October, Thursday to Tuesday. There will be no lesson for all students during the PSLE Marking Exercise.

P1 to P5 students will have HBL assignments set by their teachers to keep them meaningfully occupied with their learning during this period. More information about HBL will be provided at a later date.

12. P2 TO P5 SEMESTER ASSESSMENT 2

The P2 to P5 year-end assessment for Composition will be on 9 October, Monday, and the written papers will begin on 25 October, Wednesday. A separate letter informing parents/guardians of the SA2 details has already been given on 29 August.

13. EARLY DISMISSAL DURING SEMESTER ASSESSMENT 2 (25 TO 31 OCTOBER)

P1 to P6 students will be dismissed earlier at 12.35 p.m. during the SA2 period from Wednesday, 25 October to Tuesday, 31 October. This would allow our students to have an earlier lunch and more rest at home. Parents/Guardians who are driving to fetch your child/ward would be allowed to drive into the school from 12.50 p.m.

The usual dismissal time will resume from Wednesday, 1 November onwards.
